

ORDINANCE NO. 308

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Mariposa do ordain as follows:

SECTION I. For a period of sixty (60) calendar days commencing with April 1, 1969, the effective date of this Ordinance, and ending May 30, 1969, both days included, it is unlawful and a misdemeanor for any person, firm, or corporation, which owns, possesses, or drives any motor vehicle weighing in excess of fifteen (15) tons, gross laden weight, to drive the same or to permit or to cause the same to be driven or to travel across the following described portions of county roads in the County of Mariposa:

a. WHITLOCK ROAD

Beginning at the intersection of Whitlock Road and Highway 140 in S. W. 1/4 Sec. 1, T 5S, R18E, thence westerly to the east line of Section 1 T. 5S, R 18 E; Thence Northwesterly to the east section line of Section 2, T 5S, R 18 E; Thence westerly to the intersection of the Whitlock Road and Sherlock Road in the Northwest 1/4 of Section 3, T 5S, R 18 E; a distance of approximately 2 miles.

b. COLORADO ROAD

Beginning at intersection of Highway 140 and Colorado Road on the north line of Section 25, T 4 S, R 18 E; Thence Southwesterly to the east section line of Section 26, T 4 S, R 18 E; Thence northwesterly to the north section line of Section 26, T 4 S, R 18 E; Thence northwesterly to the N-S section line of Section 23, T 4 S, R 18 E, a distance of approximately 3500 ft.

SECTION II. Every violation of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00, or imprisonment in the Mariposa County Jail for a period not to exceed six (6) months, or by both said fine and imprisonment.


SECTION III. The Board of Supervisors have conducted, or caused to be conducted, engineering and traffic inspections and surveys concerning the above mentioned county roads. Because of the unusually wet winter caused by heavy snow and rain in

1 recent months, there are numerous temporary springs, surfacing
2 at many points along the above mentioned roads, and because of the
3 wetness caused at such points, and at other points, from ground
4 water which has appeared in excessive quantities, the use of the
5 above mentioned roads by vehicles weighing in excess of fifteen
6 (15) tons, gross laden weight, will cause immediate and severe
7 damage to the said roads, thereby creating a high risk of injury
8 to vehicles and occupants of vehicles using the said roads. The
9 above mentioned conditions, although temporary with reference to
10 all of the above mentioned roads, constitute an immediate threat
11 to public health, safety, and welfare. For the foregoing reasons,
12 this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its enactment as
13 an emergency measure for the immediate protection of the public
14 health, safety, and welfare within the meaning of sub-section (d)
15 of Government Code 25123 and the Constitution of the State of
16 California.


17 SECTION IV. If any section, sub-section, clause, para-
18 graph, or sentence, ^{or portion thereof,} of this Ordinance should be held invalid by
19 any court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not
20 vitiate or affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.
