

MARIPOSA COUNTY RESOLUTION No. 89-219

A RESOLUTION OPPOSING PENDING LEGISLATION AMENDING CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT TO REQUIRE AN ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT FOR ANY PROJECT ADVERSELY AFFECTING A HISTORICALLY SIGNIFICANT BUILDING OR RESOURCE


WHEREAS, pending legislation (SB 1188) would amend the California Environmental Quality Act to require an Environmental Impact Report for any project adversely affecting a historically significant building or resource; and

WHEREAS, SB 1188, (Marks) would amend the California Environmental Quality Act requirements to mandate an Environmental Impact Report for any project "affecting" a National Register District, or other identified historical resource.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mariposa County Board of Supervisors, a political subdivision of the State of California, that Mariposa County opposes passage of SB 1188, (Marks).
