

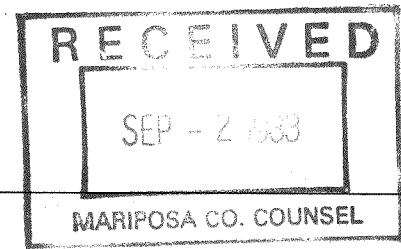

SUBJECT: Assessments to fund appeal in Poer v. Alameda

**\*\*ACTION NEEDED\*\***

As you know, the plaintiff has indicated that an appeal will be filed. The steering committee has met and discussed, at length, the possible alternatives to handling the appeal. It was decided that Don Lincoln is in the best position to represent counties on this matter. He is thoroughly familiar with the case and its issues. He has done most of the required research already, and he has proven to be an effective advocate for counties. Of course, the advantage to individual counties of a mutual defense is significantly reduced costs.

The original assessments have been nearly expended. Therefore, the steering committee has recommended additional assessments to fund the appeal. Because of the varying amounts at risk, it was felt that smaller counties should not be required to pay much more while larger counties, with the most at stake, should shoulder a greater share of the total cost. Consequently, three assessment categories, based upon population were developed. Individual county assessments are shown on the attached chart. Please note that the amount being collected is only an estimate of the funds necessary to handle the appeal. Hopefully, no future assessments will be necessary.

Assessment levels are based upon population. For dues purposes, CSAC divides counties into urban, suburban and rural sections. Using these same classifications for the Poer assessment: urban counties are assessed \$700; suburban counties are assessed \$300; and rural counties are assessed \$50.
