

Recommendation

It is respectfully requested that your Board: (1) approve a Behavioral Health contract for residential psychiatric inpatient services with Sutter Health Sacramento; and (2) authorize your Chairman to sign the contract.

Background/Current Situation

This County does not operate inpatient, residential facilities and therefore contracts for such services. This new agreement is substantially similar to other contracts currently in place.

Payment varies based on client need and insurance. The contract is summarized below:

<u>Inpatient Treatment for</u>	<u>Amount</u>
Inpatient Medi-Cal	\$743.02/day <i>80 / month</i>
Inpatient Psychiatric Professional Fee	\$ 90.00/day
Indigent/Short-Doyle/Non-Medi-Cal	\$826.00/day
Medi-Cal Administrative Rate	\$439.08/day

Financial

This contract will continue to be paid within the Mental Health budget unit 0402. Often, client income pays for part of these services, for example through Social Security or MediCal.

There is no impact on the general fund.
