

ORDINANCE NO. 288

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Mariposa do ordain as follows:

SECTION I. Effective thirty (30) days after date hereof, it shall be unlawful for the owner, possessor, or driver of any motor vehicle weighing in excess of fifteen (15) tons, gross laden weight, to permit or cause the same to travel that portion of Harris Road between the junction of Harris Road and Chowchilla Mt. Road and the junction of Harris Road and Harris Cut-off Road in the County of Mariposa.

SECTION II. For a period of thirty (30) days, commencing with the date of this ordinance, and ending June 1, 1967, both days included, it shall be unlawful for any owner, possessor, or driver of a motor vehicle weighing in excess of fifteen (15) tons, gross laden weight, to permit or cause the same to travel upon the following roads, or portions of roads, in the County of Mariposa, to wit: Triangle Road, Bootjack Road between the intersection of Bootjack Road with Usona Road and the Mariposa-Madera County line, Jerseydale Road, Harris Road from the junction of Harris Road and Chowchilla Mt. Road to the junction of Harris Road and Harris Cut-off Road, and Greeley Hill Road from the junction of Greeley Hill Road and Bull Creek Road to the junction of Greeley Hill Road and Highway 49 in the Town of Coulterville.


SECTION III. Every violation of the provisions of Section I or Section II above shall constitute a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00, or imprisonment in the Mariposa County Jail for a period not to exceed six (6) months, or by both said fine and imprisonment.

SECTION IV. The Board of Supervisors have conducted, or caused to be conducted, engineering and traffic inspections and surveys concerning the above mentioned county roads. Because of the unusually wet winter caused by heavy snow and rain in


1 recent months, there are numerous temporary springs surfacing
2 at many points along the above mentioned roads, and^{because of} the wetness
3 caused at such points, and at other points, from ground water
4 which has appeared in excessive quantities, the use of the
5 above mentioned roads by vehicles weighing in excess of fifteen
6 (15) tons, gross laden weight, will cause immediate and severe
7 damage to the said roads, thereby creating a high risk of
8 injury to vehicles and occupants of vehicles using the said roads.
9 The above mentioned conditions, although temporary with refer-
10 ence to all of the above mentioned roads except the above de-
11 scribed portion of Harris Road, constitute an immediate threat
12 to public health, safety, and welfare. The use of the above
13 described portion of Harris Road beyond a period of thirty (30)
14 days after date, by vehicles in excess of 15 tons, gross laden
15 weight, will constitute a serious threat to public health, safety,
16 and welfare until such time as the said portion of Harris Road
17 is improved. For the foregoing reasons, this ordinance shall
18 take effect immediately upon its enactment as an urgency measure
19 for the immediate protection of the public health, safety, and
20 welfare within the meaning of sub-section (d) of Government Code
21 25123 and the Constitution of the State of California.
