

ORDINANCE NO. 227

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Mariposa do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. The following motor vehicle parking regulations and restrictions shall apply to the following streets in the Town of Mariposa:

- (a) On 5th Street between Charles Street and Bullion Street, parallel parking shall be permitted on the north side, and there shall be no parking on the south side.
- (b) On 6th Street between Charles Street and the Mariposa Creek Bridge, right angle parking shall be permitted on the south side, and no parking shall be permitted on the north side.
- (c) On 6th Street between Charles and Bullion Streets, diagonal parking shall be permitted on the south side and no parking shall be permitted on the north side, except that motor vehicles may be parked primarily on privately owned property on the north side, provided no part of any vehicle so parked shall extend on to or across or into the portion of 6th Street normally used for motor vehicular travel.
- (d) On 7th Street between Charles and Bullion Streets diagonal motor vehicle parking shall be permitted on the north side immediately adjacent to the Yosemite Market property only.

SECTION 2. The Mariposa County Road Commissioner is hereby authorized and directed to immediately determine and mark on the road surface of the above mentioned streets the number and position of diagonal and right angle parking spaces permitted under this ordinance, and to post in conspicuous places along said streets signs which will adequately notify the public of the parking regulations imposed thereon under this ordinance.

SECTION 3. Any person, firm or corporation who parks a motor vehicle in or upon any portion of the above-mentioned streets in violation of the terms of this ordinance, is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed \$5.00, or by imprisonment in the County Jail for a period not to exceed one day, or by both such fine and imprisonment.


SECTION 4. The Mariposa County Road Commissioner or any

1 duly authorized peace officer may remove or cause removal of any
2 vehicle parked on the above mentioned streets in violation of the
3 terms of this ordinance and store the said vehicle, or cause it to
4 be stored, at the expense of the owner or operator thereof, when-
5 ever said Road Commissioner or duly authorized peace officer finds
6 that such vehicle so parked will constitute a serious traffic
7 hazard. Towing and storage charges under this section shall not
8 exceed the usual towing or storage charges imposed by the firm or
9 person who tows or stores such vehicle.


10 SECTION 5. The Board of Supervisors hereby finds that the
11 lack of regulation of motor vehicle parking on the above-mentioned
12 streets, and the parking of motor vehicles on both sides of the
13 above-mentioned streets, has caused a dangerous traffic condition
14 thereon, and, that in order to remove said dangerous condition and
15 provide for the safe passage of motor vehicles along the said
16 streets, it is necessary that the above provisions of this ordinance
17 be placed in effect immediately. This ordinance shall take effect
18 immediately as an emergency measure and a true copy thereof shall
19 be published in the Mariposa Gazette within 15 days.
