

MARIPOSA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS RESOLUTION No. 90-234
A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF PROPOSITION 121 THE HIGHER
EDUCATION FACILITIES BOND ACT

WHEREAS, California's public institutions of higher learning have made vast contributions to the economic, social and cultural well being of the State of California; and

WHEREAS, more than 1.9 million students are enrolled in California's public higher education system, which include the University of California, the California State University, the California Community Colleges and the California Maritime Institute; and

WHEREAS, construction of new facilities at 135 campuses of this great system of public higher education has fallen behind and new and renovated classrooms, libraries and laboratories are in short supply; and

WHEREAS, the Higher Education Facilities Bond Act, Proposition 121, would authorize the sale of \$450 million in general obligation bonds to fund the construction and renovation of classrooms, libraries and laboratories, and properly equip them; and

WHEREAS, State of the art instruction and research facilities are needed to prepare California students to fill an estimated six million new jobs in California by the year 2000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mariposa County Board of Supervisors, a political subdivision of the State of California, we endorse Proposition 121 and urge the citizens of Mariposa County, to support passage of the California Higher Education Facilities bond Act on the November ballot.






